Summary of options	<p>The paper sets out three key options:</p> <p><u><i>Package 1 – Prevention to change the trajectory of rising crime</i></u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A range of new and enhanced capabilities focused on: lifting police visibility across the country; halting the rise in crime; reducing social harm; and providing additional reassurance and capability across rural New Zealand and Auckland. • It will deliver a 10% reduction in serious crime. • Funding: \$555 million over 4 years, for 1165 new sworn and 295 non-sworn staff. <p><u><i>Package 2 – Targeted crime response</i></u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enables Police to lift response rates to meet demand and implement additional targeted crime fighting initiatives with a focus on gangs, drugs and organised crime; and enhanced capability to partner with social agencies to address and reduce family violence. • There would be with no dedicated extra resources for rural New Zealand or Auckland and limited additional crime prevention capacity. • Funding: \$484 million over 4 years, for 825 new sworn and 245 non-sworn staff. <p><u><i>Package 3 – Meeting demand pressures</i></u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enables Police to meet current demand and respond to high-impact 'volume' crime (e.g. burglary) and serious crime such as child abuse and sexual assault. • No extra prevention-focused policing, however the 'Prevention First' mindset will still be utilised by all new staff. • Funding: \$402 million over 4 years, for 625 new sworn and 195 non-sworn staff.
