

Snapshot of Baseline Survey Results in Public and Firearms Licence Holders

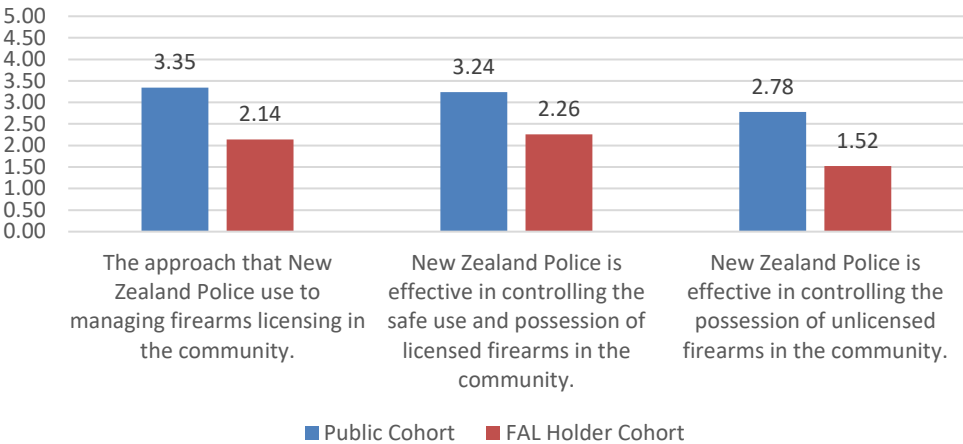
Confidence in Firearms Licencing – April 2022

- In March 2022, the firearms baseline survey was deployed to approximately 1,000 members of the New Zealand public and 1,700 recently renewed or approved firearms licence holders (FAL).
- The baseline survey sets a performance measure of public trust and confidence in the firearms licensing controls and was a result of recommendation 22b of the Royal Commission of inquiry into the terrorist attack on Christchurch masjidain.
- The survey will be repeated twice (September 2023 and September 2024) following the delivery of the Arms Transformation Programme and the establishment and embedding in of the Branded Business Unit.

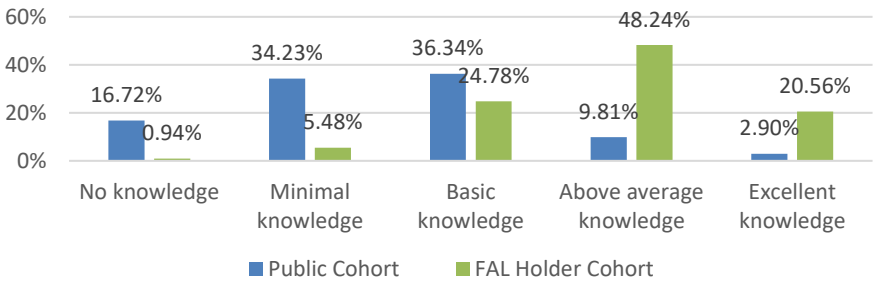
RCOI Recommendation 22b

Direct New Zealand Police (or other relevant entity) to introduce performance indicators that focus on the effective implementation of the firearms licensing system. Key indicators should include:
b) public confidence in the firearms licensing system is increased (as measured by New Zealand Police citizens’ satisfaction survey reports or similar mechanism).

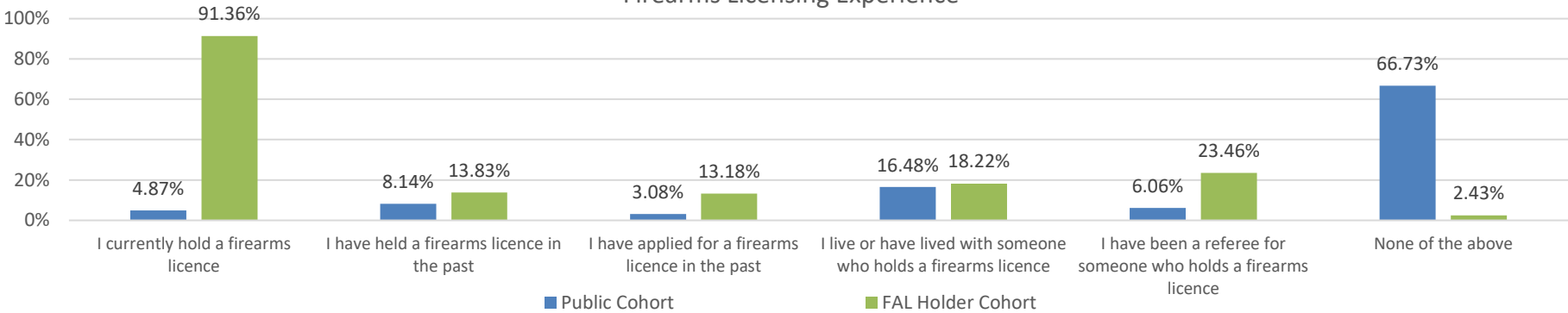
Weighted Average of Trust and Confidence



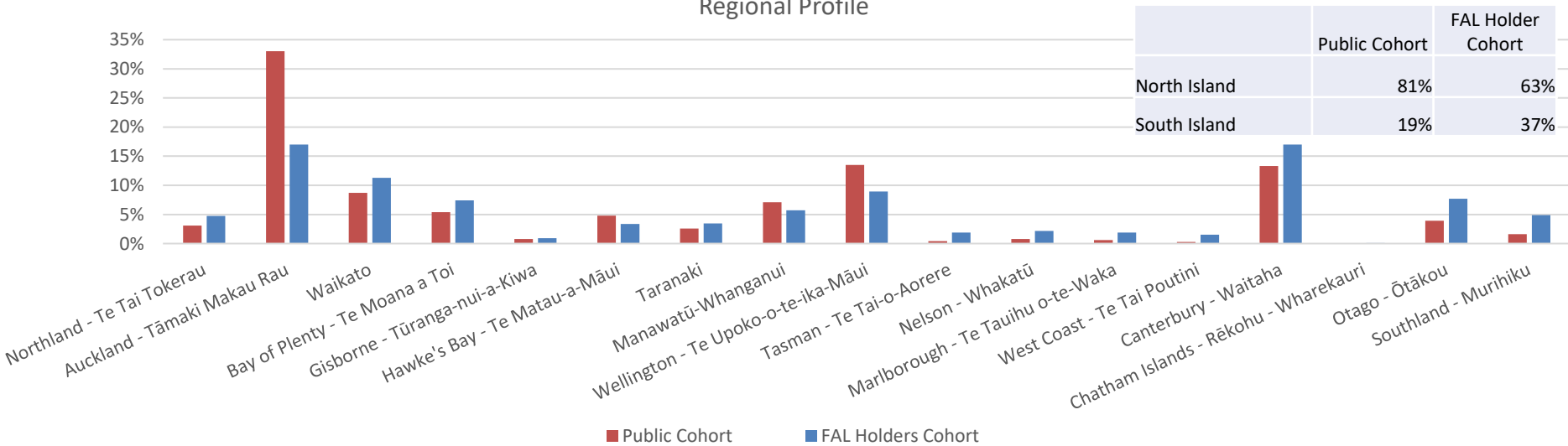
Knowledge of New Zealand Police’s approach to firearms licensing in New Zealand



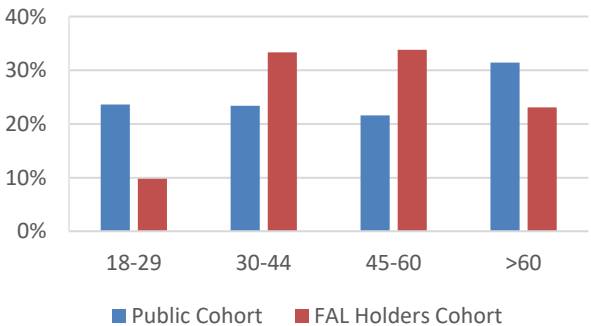
Firearms Licensing Experience



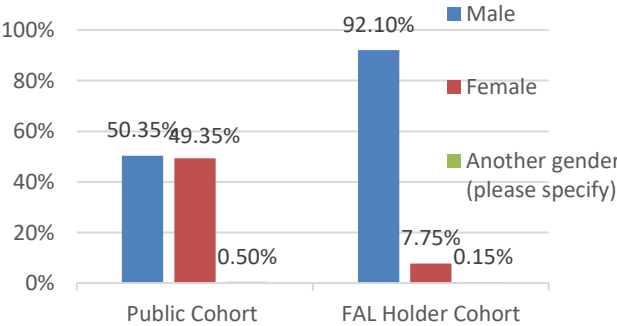
