# Firearms Prohibition Orders: Final Design Parameters

Portfolio

Police

On 14 April 2021, the Cabinet Social Wellbeing Committee:

### Firearms Prohibition Order regime design

- noted that, in July 2020, Cabinet approved in-principle the d velopment of a Firearms Prohibition Order regime subject to policy design and cost ng;
- 2 **noted** that Appendix One of the submission unde SWC 21-SUB-0053 presents refinements to the Firearms Prohibition Order model approved in principle in July 2020;
- agreed to develop a Firearms Prohibition Order regime for New Zealand, based on the parameters set out in Appendix One;

## Transitional and consequential arrangements

- 4 agreed that the making of a Fi earm. Prohibition Order will:
  - 4.1 automatically cancel any firearms licence in the name of the subject person;
  - 4.2 be a ground for di qualification under section 22H of the Arms Act 1983;
  - 4.3 be a criterin (whether the order was current, expired or revoked) of the fit and proper person test under section 24A of the Arms Act 1983;
- agre d that any firearms or other items seized as part of a breach will be managed in c ordance with current legislative provisions, including destruction provisions;
- agreed that there will be immunity for undercover officers in relation to offences under the Firearms Prohibition Order regime;
- agreed to amend section 108 of the Evidence Act 2006 to include offences under the Firearms Prohibition Order regime;
- 8 agreed that legal aid be available for appeals from the court's decision to make or not make a Firearms Prohibition Order;

- agreed that the Privacy Act 1993 be amended to include Firearms Prohibition Orders to enable information on Firearms Prohibition Orders to be shared in relation to protection orders, restraining orders or victims' orders, and/or shared with Ara Poutama Aotearoa to enable post-sentence conditions to be managed in a manner consistent with Firearms Prohibition Orders;
- agreed to amend the Search and Surveillance Act 2012 to:
  - 10.1 include offences under the Firearms Prohibition Order regime;
  - 10.2 include firearms parts in the definition of 'arms';

#### Financial implications

noted the justice sector cost of the proposed Firearms Prohibition Order regim will e incurred gradually from the 2023 enactment of the regime;

## Legislative implications and drafting instructions

- agreed to amend the Arms Act 1983 to introduc a Firearms Prohibition Order regime;
- 15 **invited** the Minister of Police to issue drafting instructions to the Parliamentary Counsel Office to amend the Arms Act 1983 to give effect to the decisions in paragraphs 3 to 10 and 14 above;
- authorised the Minister of Police to m ke any minor and technical changes required, including any additional consequential impacts on the Arms Act 1983;
- noted that the Arms (Firearms Prohibition Orders) Legislation Bill has sought a Category 4 priority on the 2021 Legislat ve Programme (referred to a select committee in 2021);
- authorised the Minister of Police, at her discretion, to share text from drafts of the Arms (Firearms Proh bit in Orders) Legislation Bill with targeted stakeholders and experts if they consider i would be useful;
- noted that the Minister of Police will instruct her officials to consult with Māori on the ex osure draft of the Arms (Firearms Prohibition Orders) Legislation Bill and report back to he Minister before legislation is introduced in the House.
