## Guide to using victimisations reports on policedata.nz

These statistics present a detailed picture of who is affected by crime in New Zealand, who is committing it, the relationship between offender and victim, and how offenders are being dealt with.

Recorded Crime Victims Statistics (RCVS) is about victims of crime, so only includes crimes that clearly have an identified victim.

RCVS<sup>1</sup> were introduced in 2014/15. Updated RCVS data are released at the end of every month to provide the most up-to-date information possible. They replace crime statistics previously released twice-yearly.

A victimisation counts each occasion of a person or organisation being victimised within an ANZSOC Division<sup>2</sup>.

Police proactively releases RCVS statistics. These are updated monthly and can be viewed and downloaded from policedata.nz<sup>3</sup>.
