4.	Project Update October 2022 Sentient Report	The monthly report was reviewed at a high level with the group. Key high level points to note: The programme has moved to overall RED status as a result of outcomes of the procurement process and the escalation as NZ Police have been unable to identify a device that it can recommend to the Minsiter that meets both policy intent and requirements. Options are being considered in collaboration with partner agencies (MoT, Waka Kotahi) with a preferred option then requiring Minister approval to proceed forward. Resources remains AMBER as OFT Project Manager to be recruited for. Risks/Issues has moved to RED. Request agreement to close Risk 12100 'OFT device is not fit for purpose for roadside volume-based testing'. Two devices were identified that could meet the volume-based testing requirement. Key Issues: Issue 12265 regarding Minimum Viable Product (MVP) meeting the intent of the legislation Risk 11066 has now moved to an Issue 12824 regarding project delivery time constraints Schedule has moved to RED. Delays in due diligence completion and no preferred option agreed have now resulted in a knock on timeline effect which will be further exacerbated with upcoming Parliamentary Christmas break. With any agreed option at this point, it will not be possible to complete the Ministerial approval process in time to achieve OFT roadside testing by March 2023. Scope has moved to RED. Due to the lack of a device, delivery of Roadside testing for the presence of drugs based is not possible. **Governance Board to provide direction around project resource reprioritisation whilst awaiting the outcome of the options development and ministerial discussions. Re-planning of OFT project will be necessary once preferred option is approved by Minister. Workshop tomorrow scheduled for partner agencies MoT, Waka Kotahi and NZP to work on recommendation. Victoria Police have refined their system over 18 years. We wanted to start our system at the point of where Victoria would like to be. SSI (1871)
