1	Welcome	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Attendees were welcomed and apologies noted. Previous Minutes accepted
2	Introductions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Introductions were made, welcoming new members
3	Agency Updates	<p>NZ Police</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Continuing to focus on any regulatory changes including infringement notice updates. There are ongoing complexities with timeframes, OIAs, liaising with procurement process etc Leaning toward amending existing infringement notices not making new.

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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Device Procurement <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Process underway, three devices which are potentially suitable being independently tested ○ Increased interest from focus groups which is positive ○ Systems and processes are underway to prepare for GoLive • Community Engagement is about to begin for initial 6 week period <p>Worksafe</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Meeting scheduled week ending 26 Aug where notifications, triaging, and external strategy are being discussed to consider how they might support the engagement/timings piece of work. May seek notifications to support and implement the new process. • Looking to provide advice and support where possible • Interested in how Worksafe could: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ align with the work NZP are progressing, especially around community engagement initially ○ potentially share information and support referrals <p>MoH</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Working through how they can specifically support the legislation from Health perspective. Items under discussion include Naloxone (reverses overdose) query, utensils (maybe reqd), testing staff having the right info and tools for different scenarios/drugs. drug foundation role etc. • Engagement and education will be key. • Link into NZP resources for Medicinal cannabis levels and policy to cover off some of the above points. <p>MoT</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Currently drafting policy update to Minister including findings from research article of people presenting at ED with psychoactive substances. Requested input from NZP policy and OFT project and Waka Kotahi. Unlikely to be able to contribute on this occasion with paper due the day following this meeting. Happy to contribute relevant important information in future with more leadtime requested. • Amendments to regulations being developed on medical defence for infringement form notices. In order to support new testing regime timeline, amendments will need to go to Cabinet this side of Xmas. Will be putting up advice to Minister very shortly. <p>Waka Kotahi</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • FYI-Restructure of the internal Steering Group underway. MoU of current drug driving under development. Working with NZP OFT project and MoJ to capture information. • If blood sample test data already supplied to WK includes drug data in the future how would that data be collected and utilized. <p>MoJ</p> <p>Working with NZP OFT project and Waka Kotahi to capture information ensuring infringement alignment, charging codes etc.</p>
4	Agency Reporting Progress	<p>Agency data Requirements</p> <p>Existing Open Action: Agencies have been invited to provide their information requirements around OFT/Drugged driving, supporting the new legislation ongoing in BAU. These requirements could include Strategic (year on year), Tactical (month on month), Operational (day to day, week to week).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What can we anticipate and opportunities can be explored. • Data sets required and what/how the different agencies can capture/provide is first step for all before interagency data sharing opportunities can be fully explored. <p>Worksafe</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sectors trends could help plan intervention. Any workplace vehicle use data could be useful. Meetings scheduled over next 2 weeks to inform more. <p>Waka Kotahi (WK)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Still currently unclear on what can actually be tested for and/or shared.

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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Consideration as to what officers can test for at roadside without compromising safety etc. • Start for now with useful high level data if it can be supplied: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Were drugs involved? ○ Do we know which drug and what level? Build more into this in future if appropriate • If unable to capture at side of road, could that data be collected subsequently from another agency after a test. With Privacy considerations always paramount, can agencies still work together with data sources. Joining data sets together from different agencies for planning and analysis of trends, referrals, interventions and remedial services. Conversations underway with Stats NZ to consider reality of this. • WK keen to utilize e-services in near future. Would require a change in legislation to enable capture of email addresses. <p>MoH</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Referrals- Waka Kotahi advised they could potentially provide crash data, locations etc already. Could then be mixed with other agency data for more intervention/remedial health work to be planned for and offered. <p>MoJ</p> <p>Action: NZP OFT project provide draft of the codes to MoJ representative</p> <p>The Chair prompted a friendly reminder that the extended invite to provide Agency information requirements cannot remain open-ended with constrained delivery timelines to be considered. Attendees are strongly encouraged to provide any requirements prior to or by 15 Sept meeting. Without clear requirements we are unable to consider sharing ability and/or build into a model once accurately assessed. Please note: Some information may not be able to be shared.</p>
5	Community Consultation	<p>OFT project Change Manager provided update on Community Consultation.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Just working through finalizing/approvals of remaining Consultation Packs material which is then provided to Community Consultation Leads (CCL)s in next few weeks. • CCLs are across all the districts and will have the Consultation Packs and other resources to fully engage with their communities. • Particularly interested in deployment Community Consultation which takes place over 6 weeks with Pilot then beginning in March 2023 and covers how police will deploy OFT on the roadside. • At end of 6 weeks, feedback and briefings inform action plans. • Campaigns follow with input from the feedback. Envisage end of 2022 year to run through 2023. • Waka Kotahi is leading the main campaign with engagement and alignment with as many other other agencies and groups as possible.
