		 Police currently working with MoT and WK to deliver on the requirements and policy intent of the legislation. 	
		 Development continues in other areas supporting the legislation, such as the introduction of drug driving infringements, to support the March 2023 delivery. Infringements and forms – Continue to work with MoJ on finalising forms. ESR testing fees – drafting Memo and Gazette Notice for Minister. Test fees for base testing will be around \$1780 (inc GST). NZP taking the opportunity to Gazette alcohol test fee increase at same time. Once approved, Gazette Notice can be published. Note: If Minister elects not to Gazette fee increase, there is another process NZP would need to move to. New test fees structure will provide wider data set than currently which will be useful to other agencies as well ie MoT and MoH. Training material for staff underway. General info sheet has been developed detailing the upcoming changes. Reach out for a copy if you have not seen it and wish to. It has not been uploaded as yet. Additional fact sheets are under development over next short while.

		Continue to work collaboratively with NZP Change Manager on Q&As and other material. Training for steff begins in ground 2 weeks.	
		 Training for staff begins in around 3 weeks. Query raised around Medical Defence infringements being submitted for consideration. NZP confirmation that as long as the standard NZP infringement services link is utilized, all the required info will be there, with applications able to be electronic or hard copy mail format. There is also a prompt to ensure everything has been included/attached to consider application fully. An awareness that most prescriptions are issued online or through MyHealth portal, which in some cases would require authenticity confirmation from prescriber to NZP as part of application.
