I am writing to you in response to your request dated 27 March 2019. You asked:

Information relating to the development and any subsequent review of the police Firearms Licence vetting process including:

- 1. Advice received both internal (police) and external sources (expert advice) on the objectives and form of questions to be asked of applicants, near relative, referees.
- 2. Reviews of the objectives and form of questions to be asked of applicants, near relative, referees.
- 3. Questionnaires from the implementation of the Arms Act 1983 to date (and any iteration that incorporates a significant review/change i.e. minor adjustments/typographical corrections etc are not required) used by vetting staff for interviews with applicants, near relative and referees.

The history of firearms regulation in New Zealand is published on the Police website<sup>1</sup>. In 1996, the Minister of Police commissioned a review of the firearms licensing regime and the report is published on the Police website.<sup>2</sup>

New Zealand Police developed the vetting process in accordance with the legislation, following discussion with external and internal stakeholders, and approval by the Police executive and, ultimately, the Police Commissioner. New Zealand Police has established a Firearms Community Advisory Forum to act in a consultative and advisory capacity to Police, and all the minutes of this forum are regularly published on the Police website<sup>3</sup>. The key documents that were developed in this process were the Arms Manual<sup>4</sup>, the Arms Code<sup>5</sup>, and the Vetting Guide.

Originally the Vetting Guide was an aide memoir and was not very prescriptive. Because it was open to interpretation, Police consulted internally and externally to create a more specific guide, listing questions to be asked and information to be collected. The guide was also reviewed by the Victoria University of Wellington Psychology Faculty staff, who had commented that, bearing in mind the inherent flaws in interviewing as a technique, they recognised that the guide would achieve the outcome Police was looking for (identifying unsuitable applicants).

The Vetting Guide has been a living document. It has been regularly updated with new case law and district practices. The main changes to the Vetting Guide are listed below:

- 1995 Amendments to licensing process consequent upon the introduction
  of the Arms Act 1983, Regulation 19 introduced, Regulation 19 "waiver"
  applied constable visit (to inspect security) optional, Introduced certificate
  of approval for issue of licence by approving officer delegated to Arms
  Officers, Introduced next of kin referee interview: full interview of
  spouse/partner/next of kin, in their home.
- "Aide memoir" interview sheet introduced. An outline for the interviews.
- 2002 initially issued in the older format, but soon updated to include the authorising officers' certificate on the front page, Introduced the identity assessment (score system based on Identity Framework administered by the Department of Internal Affairs), Introduced intelligence checks to be performed in the (then new) Police computer systems.
- 2005 new guidance for application of the requirements, Clarification of next of kin, Explanation about dealer licences checks, and about people who hold licences that are due to expire ("renewal").
- 2008 Levels of delegation set out, Expanded checks to be done in computer systems, Typographical and formatting edits, More space to record standard licence firearms, Security requirements.
- 2010 full text of questions that need to be asked, Supplementary questions for dealer and endorsement applications, Expanded relationship section, moved security section into a separate booklet, Expanded security guide
- 2011 new layout
- 2015 electronic form
- 2016 additional security report

I attach the current version of the Vetting Guide. The previous iterations of the Vetting Guide are withheld under section 18(f) of the Official Information Act 1982 as the requested information cannot be made available without substantial collation or research. In arriving at this decision, I have first considered whether fixing a charge and/or extending the time for response would enable the request to be granted. You have the right to seek an investigation and review by the Ombudsman of this decision.

For your information, Police has developed a process for proactive release of information, so the anonymised response to your request may be publicly released on the New Zealand Police website.

## 14. Regulation 19 (Extract)

#### Regulation 19 (extract) - Conditions relating to security precautions

- (1) Every firearms licence shall be subject to the following conditions:
  - (a) The holder shall not put a firearm in such a place that a young child has ready access to it:
  - (b) The holder, where he or she has both a firearm and ammunition for it in his or her possession, either
    - (i) Shall take reasonable steps to ensure that the ammunition is not stored in such a way that a person who obtains access to the firearm also obtains access to the ammunition; or
    - (ii) Shall ensure that, where the ammunition is stored with the firearm, the firearm is not capable of being discharged:
  - (c) The holder shall take reasonable steps to ensure that any firearm in holder's possession is secured against theft:
- (2) On and after the 1st day of July 1993 the reasonable steps required by subclause (1)(c) of this regulation shall include
  - (a) Keeping on the holder's premises -
    - (i.) A lockable cabinet, container, or receptacle of stout construction in which firearms may be stored; or
    - (ii) A lockable steel and concrete strongroom in which firearms may be stored; or
    - (iii) A display cabinet or rack in which firearms may be immobilised and locked so that none of them may be fired; and
  - (b) Keeping locked or immobilised and locked in the cabinet, container, receptacle, strongroom, display cabinet, or rack required by paragraph (a) of this subclause every firearm which is on the holder's premises and which is not under immediate and personal supervision of the holder or some other holder of a firearms licence; and
- (c.) Ensuring that no firearm in the holder's possession is left in a vehicle that is unattended.
