Request for information

Thank you for your Official Information Act 1982 (OIA) request dated 18 July 2022. You wrote:

I am seeking to understand the extent of delays to the relicensing of those holding a New Zealand Firearms License.

For each existing firearms license holder who has applied since 1 January 2020 to have their firearms license renewed, could you please advise:

- 1. The date their re-licensing application was received,
- 2. The date their license expired,
- 3. Whether their re-license was: Reissued, Revoked/Declined or Still Being Processed, and
- 4. The date their firearm license was re-issued.

Between 1 January 2020 and 31 July 2022, New Zealand Police received 29,840 applications for a renewal of a standard firearms licence.

Of these, 23,370 are now active (ie, they have been renewed), 554 were refused, cancelled, or surrendered, 101 are now suspended or revoked (they may have been initially renewed but revoked later), and 5,815 are still in progress.

It is not possible to identify the previous expiry date after a licence application has been completed as the new expiry date overwrites the previous expiry date in Police's firearms licensing system.

In June 2022, Police added a new field to the computer system indicating when the applicant has completed all the required parts of the application and Police can begin processing the application. This was done because in the past, Police had to wait for the

applicant to complete the Firearms Safety Course or to provide referee information or to provide some parts of the application that were incomplete, but the application date was recorded as when they first submitted the form and paid the fee. The new "ready for processing" date better reflects the date when Police is able to begin processing the full application.

The table below shows the number of licences that were applied for between 1 January 2020 and 31 July 2022 and are now active, by month of their application date (or ready for processing date as described above) and time it took to process the renewal.

Of the licences that are currently in progress, 816 are waiting on the applicant (for example, not all information was provided or suitable referees have not yet been nominated) and 4,999 are being processed by New Zealand Police. The 4,999 applications are shown by the month they began being processed below.
