Request for information

Thank you for your Official Information Act 1982 request dated 10 June 2024. You wrote:

Could I please request statistics on how many ram raids and aggravated robberies on retail premises have been committed over the past five years, broken down by the age and gender of the offender/s?

You then added:

Is it possible to amend this though to be both ram raids and aggravated robberies on retail premises?

In the Official Police Statistics, information about offenders is collated in Recorded Crime Offenders Statistics (RCOS). Police proactively releases RCOS statistics. These are updated monthly and can be viewed and downloaded from policedata.nz¹.

The 'Proceedings (offender demographics)' report has information on offender demographics. Please note that the public report updates on the last working day of every month two months in arrears.

You have asked for specific information about proceedings related to ram raids and aggravated robberies at retail locations that are a subset of the published RCOS information.

As 'ram raid' does not have its own offence code, Police usually categorises a ram raid as a burglary offence under New Zealand legislation and in ANZSOC² division 07 Unlawful entry and related offences. Aggravated robbery is in ANZSOC division 06 robbery and related offences.

Table 1 below shows proceedings against offenders for robbery or burglary in occurrences identified as a ram raid³ at retail locations, January 2019 to April 2024.
