

Police are working towards medium term crime reduction targets driven by the Prevention First Strategy (13% reduction against 2008/09) and commitment to Better Public Services (June 2011 to June 2017; 15% reduction in overall crime, 20% reduction in violent crime, 25% reduction in youth crime rate).
