INCREASED foot patrols

Foot patrols per 10,000 people

The target is 140 foot patrols per 10,000 people. Foot patrols give Police visibility in the community, act as a crime deterrent and enable Police to understand community problems and concerns.



PROMPT response

% of resolved crimes within 30 days
where the victim is a person

The target is 90% or higher of resolved offences where the victim is a person (ie not crimes against organisations or administrative offences), resolved within 30 days of the offence being recorded by Police. Resolving offences in a prompt and efficient manner supports victims.



Public feeling SAFER

% of people feeling safe in their
neighbourhood during the day

The target is 92% of respondents or higher indicating that people feel either *very safe* or *safe* in their neighbourhood during the day. Public feelings of safety improve community wellbeing.



LESS crime

Police are working towards crime reduction targets driven by the Prevention First Strategy (13% reduction against 2008/09) and commitment to Better Public Services (June 2011 to June 2017; 15% reduction in overall crime, 20% reduction in violent crime, 25% reduction in youth crime rate).

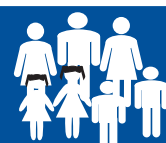


GREATER TRUST in Police

% of people who trust and have confidence in Police

The target is 78% or more of survey respondents indicate *full* or *quite a lot* of trust and confidence in Police.



FEWER victims

The target is a 5% reduction in the number of victims of crime compared with the previous year. More Police resources have gone into prevention focused activities.

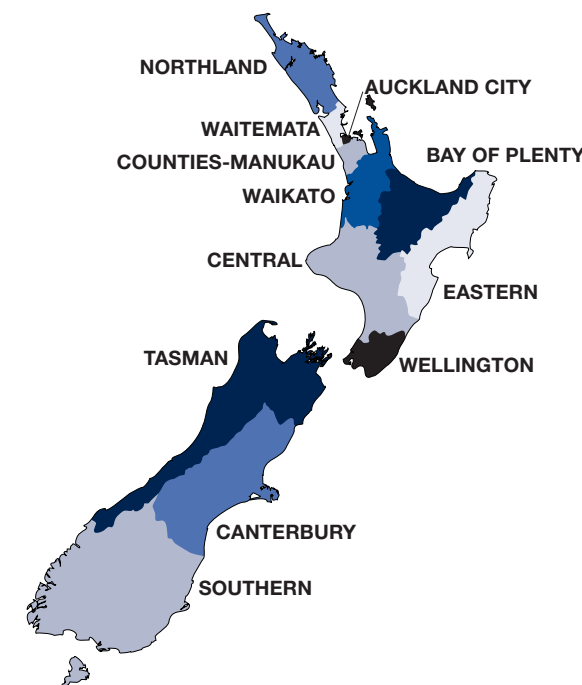


FEWER serious crashes

Crash-related hospitalisations of more than one day

The target is a reduction in the number of hospitalisations of longer than one day as a result of traffic crashes compared to the previous year. This measure is driven by the Safer Journeys strategy in partnership with Ministry of Transport, the NZ Transport Agency, ACC and local government. Auckland Metro includes Waitemata, Auckland City and Counties-Manukau Districts. Hospitalisation data is not available for these individual Police Districts.
