Investment Objectives

Compliance with regulatory requirements.

Police currently detect drug driving after carrying out an impairment test using CIT processes and requesting a blood sample. Under Police are required to implement the Land Transport (Drug Driving) Amendment Act and initiate OFT in line with government directions.

2. Safer roads through improved detection and general deterrence of drug drivers on NZ roads.

Drug driver apprehension is currently limited to detection by officers when a driver is suspected to be impaired by drugs. This is achieved via a CIT test. It is anticipated that a random and compulsory OFT regime like that employed for drink driving, will significantly improve detection of drug drivers and will aid in general deterrence principles.

Executive Summary

The Land Transport (Drug Driving) Amendment Bill progressed, and Royal Assent was confirmed 11 March 2022. Police now have 12 months to implement changes. The OFT Project will seek approval to transition from Start-Up to the Design/Delivery phase.

The OFT GB endorsed the single stage Business Case.

The Equipment Procurement tender RFP was released onto GETS 23 March with responses due by 27 April 2022.

Progress this period

Royal Assent was confirmed on 11 March for the Land Transport (Drug Driving) Amendment Bill to be enacted.

The OFT Project will be looking to move into the Delivery stage in April

As at 31 March 2022:

The new Strategic Communications Lead commenced 1 March.

Review of the project's communication and engagement strategy and work to develop the OFT Intranet site and communication channels has begun.

The NIA Reference Group prioritisation request was accepted by NRG.

The OFT Project's Single Stage business case and Risk Profile Assessment (RPA) of a Medium rating was endorsed by OFT GB along with the Assurance Plan, the RPA rating was agreed with Treasury post OFTGB endorsement.

RPM District engagement has been completed on the proposed Deployment Strategy, with the strategy will now out for wider engagement with external stakeholders.

Following completion of the legislation passing through Parliament, a full impact review is underway to ensure all deliverables from the changes through the readings in the house are incorporated

The OFT device RFP was released to the market through GETS 23 March

Preparation for a workshop with all business stakeholders to walk through the changes as an outcome of the legislation to identify any additional impacts and raise awareness

Next Steps

Confirm the Projects's engagement strategy for personnel in affected workgroups.

Hold Workshop with all areas of the business to review impacts of changes

Agree Police's scope in relation to all changes introduced by the Bill

The EP RFP Tender closes 27 April. Short-listing of devices and a trial phase exercise at the Plimmerton CVST station will follow in May.

Project to commence looking at reporting requirements to support both operational and evaluation needs.

A Business Analyst will be on-boarded.

Status Report Comment:

Mitigation: This risk is not only applicable to OFT but also other road traffic offences. As current ploicy sits, options for supported resolutions are limited to none. Potential options currently used by NZ Police include:

- Te Pae Oranga (Community / Iwi Panels)
- Police Diversion (owned by Police Prosecution Service)
- Traffic Compliance Scheme (Run through the PIB)

In 2019 the courts released the decision of Zhang v R which shifted the mindset of the justice system in relation to the way they approach drug offending. It identified the effects of addictions and the need to help people as opposed to setting harsher punishments for them as a deterrence.

Mitigation: • Clearly and explicitly communicate the legislative requirements in the Request for Proposal (RFP).

- Ensure the Tender evaluation Team only shortlist responses that meet the legislative requirements.
- Directly negotiate with responders that are almost compliant.
- Engage with other agencies and inform stakeholder of outcome of RFP if no device currently available.
- Identify options, i.e. increase use of CIT, in the short term until a fit for purpose device is available
- Incorporate the outcome of not having a device into the communications plan as a back-up
