#### Request for information

Thank you for your request of 7 April 2022, in which you requested the following:

I would like to file an Official Information Act request in relation to the NZ Parliament Protest / Occupation held 6 February 2022 – 2 March 2022 (24 days). In this time:

1. How many arrests were made in connection to the protest

2. a) On day 3 (February 10th)

3. b) On day 24 (March 2nd)

4. c) In total during that time period.

5. d) In total INCLUDING and since protest / occupation, but still related to the protest / occupation.

2. How many charges were laid in connection to the protest

3. a) On day 3 (February 10th)

4. b) On day 24 (March 2nd)

5. c) In total during that time period.

6. d) In total INCLUDING and since protest / occupation, but still related to the protest / occupation.I'

3. How many of the above people arrested have had charges against them dropped?

4. How many charges in total out of the above have been dropped?

5. How many of the above charged spent time in prison / police cells?

6. What was the duration those charged were held in custody? (Can be separated into ranges for easier collation)

Your request has been considered in accordance with the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA), and I can now provide the following response.

As you may be aware, the Independent Police Conduct Authority (IPCA) has commenced an independent investigation and review (Review) of the policing of the occupation on and around Parliament grounds in Wellington during February and March 2022 (Protest).

Details of the scope of the Review are available on the IPCA's website<sup>1</sup> and you will note this scope includes the powers used to keep the peace, maintain public safety, enforce the law, and provide community support and reassurance, and the tactical exercise of those powers.

Whilst this Review is underway, information relating to the issues under investigation and review is expected to be the subject of examination by the IPCA under its powers of investigation under the IPCA Act 1988. With this Review commenced, there is a strong public interest in allowing these matters to be considered in the round by the IPCA.

In the meantime, please see below the responses to your questions.

- 1. How many arrests were made in connection to the protest
- 2. a) On day 3 (February 10th)
- 3. b) On day 24 (March 2nd)
- 4. c) In total during that time period.

5. d) In total INCLUDING and since protest / occupation, but still related to the protest / occupation.

There were 108 persons arrested at the Protest on 10 February, 95 persons arrested on 2 March, and 252 persons arrested in total between 9 February and 4 March.

The Police investigation into criminal activity is still underway. While the number of people identified or sought by Police is part of the ongoing investigation, there have been a further nine prosecutions and a supported resolution referral for one youth, as part of that investigation. As the investigation continues further arrests are likely.

- 3. a) On day 3 (February 10th)

6. d) In total INCLUDING and since protest / occupation, but still related to the protest / occupation.

There were 108 persons charged in relation to behaviour at the Protest on 10 February, 90 persons charged in relation to behaviour on 2 March, and 234 persons were charged in total. Some of these individuals were charged with more than one offence.

As noted above, the Police investigation into criminal activity is still underway with a further nine prosecutions and a supported resolution referral for one youth. As the investigation continues further charges are likely.

- 3. How many of the above people arrested have had charges against them dropped?
- 4. How many charges in total out of the above have been dropped?

As of 1 June, Police records showed that approximately 65 persons have had one or more charges withdrawn.

5. How many of the above charged spent time in prison / police cells?

Attached is an anonymised list of Police arrests at the Protest for 10 February, and 2-4 March 2022.

Regarding prison cells, on 10 February seven individuals refused to sign Police bail notices so could not be bailed and were held to appear in Court the next day. At Court on 11 February the same individuals all refused to sign Court bail notices so were held in Arohata Prison. They were released late afternoon on 14 February 2022 when Police indicated we would accept release with no bail conditions.

6. What was the duration those charged were held in custody? (Can be separated into ranges for easier collation)

Attached is an anonymised list of detainees for 10 February, and 2-4 March 2022. This has two times included which together reflect the period an individual was in the custody of Police: Timings of arrest and released time/date.

The IPCA anticipates the Review will be completed and reported on by 31 March 2023. Police recognises the importance of transparency in these matters and looks forward to the release of the IPCA's report, at which time more detailed information regarding the Police response to the Protest is likely to be publicly available.

Please note that as part of its commitment to openness and transparency, Police proactively releases some information and documents that may be of interest to the public. An anonymised version of this response may be publicly released on the New Zealand Police website.

2. Also, the police stated they could not establish meaningful communication with the "Convoy 2022" protest organisers. I would like to request the documents or communications that were intended for communication with the "Convoy 2022" protest organisers over the period of 08/02/2022 - 12/02/2022.

3. I would like to request all documentation or notices of illegal activity issued to the "Convoy 2022" protest organisers or the "Convoy 2022" protestors during the period of the 08/02/2022 - 12/02/2022.

4. I would like to request any information held by the New Zealand Police that has been referred to by the New Zealand Police as 'misinformation' as it relates to the "Convoy 2022" protest during the period 08/02/2022 - 12/02/2022.

5. I would like to request any communications between the New Zealand Police and any and all representatives of the following companies; Stuff Limited, over the period of 08/02/2022 - 12/02/2022.

Your request has been considered in accordance with the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA), and I can now provide the following response.

As you may be aware, the Independent Police Conduct Authority (IPCA) has commenced an independent investigation and review (Review) of the policing of the occupation on and around Parliament grounds in Wellington during February and March 2022 (Protest).

Details of the scope of the Review are available on the IPCA's website<sup>1</sup> and you will note this scope includes Police operational execution (including tactics), Police engagement with protestors and other stakeholders, and management of intelligence.

Whilst this Review is underway, information relating to the issues under investigation and review is expected to be the subject of examination by the IPCA under its powers of investigation under

Where such information is available, it is withheld in reliance upon section 9(2)(ba)(ii) of the OIA. It is in the public interest for the Review to be completed without earlier predetermination of the matters it is considering.

3. I would like to request all documentation or notices of illegal activity issued to the "Convoy 2022" protest organisers or the "Convoy 2022" protestors during the period of the 08/02/2022 - 12/02/2022.

Please find attached copies of the following documents:

- Standard conditions for the use of Parliament Grounds
- Trespass notice relating to Parliament Buildings dated 10 February 2022.

Please note the personal details of the trespassed person have been redacted pursuant to section 9(2)(a) of the OIA, to protect personal privacy.

People who were arrested and released also received a standard summons or bail notice.

5. I would like to request any communications between the New Zealand Police and any and all representatives of Stuff Limited, over the period of 08/02/2022 - 12/02/2022.

Please refer to Attachment 1 for copies of email correspondence between Police and employees of Stuff Limited, between 8 and 12 February 2022. Some information has been withheld under section 9(2)(a) of the OIA, protect the privacy of natural persons. Police does not consider the public interest in the release of this information outweighs the reasons for withholding it.

The IPCA anticipates the Review will be completed and reported on by 31 March 2023. A small part of Molesworth Street remains impassable to through traffic and the area around Parliament, including the northern end of Lambton Quay and lower Bowen Street, should be avoided and alternate routes sought.

I understand that Cann quit after a police investigation, Operation Manu, last year revealed he was having an affair with suspected drug dealer  $\frac{s9(2)(a)}{s}$ 

**S9(2)(a)** was arrested when the investigation terminated in late October and was charged with possession of methamphetamine, offering to supply methamphetamine, and conspiring to sell methamphetamine.

- What inquiries into Cann's conduct were underway at that time?

- What were the findings of any of those inquiries into Cann's conduct, or did he resign before they could be concluded?

- How did police first become aware of Cann's relationship with  $\frac{9(2)(a)}{2}$ ? Was it through a tip (either external or internal) or via Operation Manu?

- What systems are in place to ensure police officers aren't corrupted?

- What are the police's policies around staff having relationships with people who might be involved in criminal offending?

I appreciate many agencies are involved with young offenders, but I am keen to get police's perspective on how they handle them.

Things I would like to talk to someone about include:

\*What the process is for "processing" people too young to be charged, and if there are special considerations during the apprehension of especially young offenders. I imagine it's quite different to dealing with a seasoned 40-something who has a lengthy history of offending.

\*You made mention of other agencies being involved when young people offend. I imagine those agencies work together/share information with each other. It would be great to talk about how, from police's perspective, those processes work, how/if they have changed over the years and why they're important.

\*While arresting young people for offending is one thing, I imagine police do some proactive/educational things to try to deter young people from committing crime. I imagine that's what the old Blue Light Disco was about back in the day. I'm interested in what police do these days (although I imagine Covid has put a spanner in the works of a few programmes) to try to encourage pro-social behaviour among young people.

\*Perhaps it's just me, but I imagine a lot of young people who offend come from familial backgrounds that are less than ideal. That's informed from what I see when I cover Youth Court. Is it the same for those very very young people being apprehended, or is it more a case of "kids being kids"?

I hope that gives a bit more context as to where I'm coming from with this story. And yes, I'm looking at it more as a national story.


I got an OIA back recently about the youngest people apprehended by police last year. I've attached it to this email.

I appreciate many agencies are involved with young offenders, but I am keen to get police's perspective on how they handle them.

Things I would like to talk to someone about include:

\*What the process is for "processing" people too young to be charged, and if there are special considerations during the apprehension of especially young offenders. I imagine it's quite different to dealing with a seasoned 40-something who has a lengthy history of offending.

\*You made mention of other agencies being involved when young people offend. I imagine those agencies work together/share information with each other. It would be great to talk about how, from police's perspective, those processes work, how/if they have changed over the years and why they're important.

\*While arresting young people for offending is one thing, I imagine police do some proactive/educational things to try to deter young people from committing crime. I imagine that's what the old Blue Light Disco was about back in the day. I'm interested in what police do these days (although I imagine Covid has put a spanner in the works of a few programmes) to try to encourage pro-social behaviour among young people.

\*Perhaps it's just me, but I imagine a lot of young people who offend come from familial backgrounds that are less than ideal. That's informed from what I see when I cover Youth Court. Is it the same for those very very young people being apprehended, or is it more a case of "kids being kids"?

I hope that gives a bit more context as to where I'm coming from with this story. And yes, I'm looking at it more as a national story.

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



In reference to the above, you requested:

1. How many stolen/damaged/abandoned vehicles has the police removed in Hamilton and the Waikato district in 2020, 2021 and 2022 (to date)? I would like this information broken down on a year by year basis.

2. What has been the cost of removing stolen/damaged/abandoned vehicles in Hamilton and the Waikato district in 2020, 2021 and 2022 (to date)? I would like this information broken down on a year by year basis.

Your request has been considered in accordance with the Official Information Act 1982. I can advise:

- 1. Vehicles which are stolen and vehicles damaged in crashes are towed with the consent of the registered owner or driver. The registered owner or driver is normally liable for any towing and storage fees as a result. In rare cases, Police may tow without the consent of the registered owner if, for example, it is likely to be re-stolen. Any costs incurred by Police for towing would almost certainly come out of each District's budget.
- 2. Abandoned vehicles are referred to the road controlling authority Waka Kotahi or the respective local council for removal. Police would normally only remove such a vehicle if it posed a hazard to road users.
- 3. There is no central database that records when stolen/damaged/abandoned vehicles are towed by Police, nor is there any operational reason to need such a database that would outweigh the costs involved in maintaining such a database. Individual records of tows would generally be recorded within the details of each occurrence.

We are unable to provide some of the information you have requested pursuant to section 18(f) of the Act as the information requested cannot be made available without substantial collation or research.

If you have any questions, you may contact me.

You have the right to ask the Ombudsman to review my decision if you are not satisfied with Police's response to your request.

This is a follow up request to a request I submitted through the FYI website (REF: IR-01-22-15649) for three National Intelligence Centre reports. In your response letter of 17 June, you advised me that my request was refused citing 9(2)(ba)(ii) as the reports had some bearing on the IPCA investigation into the protests at Parliament and had been provided to IPCA. To provide myself with some context for your decision, I would like to make a follow up request for this this information: I would like to know which, if any, of the following Police Instructions have been provided by Police to IPCA for their Parliament protest review: 1) TENR - Operational threat assessment 2) Use of Force Overview 3) Use of Force - Oleoresin Capsicum spray 4) Use of Force - eXact Impact QX1006 5) Public Order Policing - Unlawful Assembly and-or Rioting 6) Public Order Policing - Mass Arrest Planning 7) Public Order Policing - Demonstrations 8) Public Order Policing - Police Support Units

Your request has been considered in accordance with the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA), and I can now provide the following response.

As previously advised, the Independent Police Conduct Authority (IPCA) has commenced an independent investigation and review (Review) of the policing of the occupation on and around Parliament grounds in Wellington during February and March 2022 (Protest). In undertaking this Review, the IPCA is engaging its powers of investigation under the IPCA Act 1988 (the IPCA Act). These powers include the IPCA's ability to require:

- the Commissioner of Police to provide to the IPCA all such information and assistance as is necessary for the proper performance by the IPCA of its functions in relation to its investigation of any complaint, incident, or other matter (section 21(1) of the IPCA Act); and
- require any person to furnish information, and to produce such documents or things in the possession or under the control of that person (section 24(1) of the IPCA Act).

The IPCA is required to perform its functions and duties independently of the Police (section 4AB), and under section 33(3) of the IPCA Act any information given or any document produced

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during any investigation by or proceedings before the IPCA shall be privileged in the same manner as if the investigation or proceedings were proceedings in a court.

As the Review is ongoing, Police is unable to provide information on what the IPCA has requested, and what Police has provided in response is refused pursuant to section 9(2)(ba)(ii). However, we can confirm we have been requested to provide information, have provided information, and will continue to do so during the full course of the Review.

The IPCA anticipates the Review will be completed and reported on by 31 March 2023. Police recognises the importance of transparency in these matters and looks forward to the release of the IPCA's report, at which time more detailed information regarding the Police response to the Protest is likely to be publicly available.

Please note that as part of its commitment to openness and transparency, Police proactively releases some information and documents that may be of interest to the public. An anonymised version of this response may be publicly released on the New Zealand Police website.

## Request for information

Thank you for your request of 21 June 2022, in which you requested the following:

In response to a recent OIA request lodged via FYI seeking information on "ODESC meetings relating to Parliament protests" (ref OIA-2021/22-1337; FYI URL https://fyi.org.nz/request/18760-odesc-meetings-relating-to-parliament-protests), DPMC noted in one of its responses that they had consulted with police about the response, and that

"As part of this consultation, New Zealand Police, having also consulted with the Office of the

Ombudsman, advised DPMC that there was a good public interest in withholding information

relating to issues under investigation and review by the Independent Police Conduct Authority (IPCA)."

I am interested in these consultations by police and how they affect OIA decisionmaking. I would like to request the following information under the OIA:

\* all communications with the IPCA, or the Office of the Ombudsman about this request (for example, emails, a record of a phone call, or notes of conversations).

For clarity, I am \_not\_ seeking information on the actual ODESC meetings, or any issue relating to the IPCA investigation or parliamentary protests; I am interested solely in the consultation with other agencies and the advice they gave which influenced this OIA decision. With respect to s9 withholding grounds, public interest factors favouring release include the accountability of officials for decision-making, public understanding of how agencies interpret the law and what they understand it to be, and transparency.

I am specifically interested in information held by \_police\_ about this; a parallel request has been filed with DPMC to see what you told them and what other information

Your request has been considered in accordance with the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA), and I can now provide the following response.

As you may be aware, the Independent Police Conduct Authority (IPCA) has commenced an independent investigation and review (Review) of the policing of the occupation on and around Parliament grounds in Wellington during February and March 2022 (Protest).

Details of the scope of the Review are available on the IPCA's website<sup>1</sup> and you will note this scope includes Police engagement with local and national agencies where Police and those agencies needed to work together to develop and execute operational plans.

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Police did not consult with the IPCA or the Ombudsman regarding the specific OIA request you refer to, and your request is therefore refused under section 18(e) as the information requested does not exist.

Police did consult with the Ombudsman regarding a broader approach to information sharing to ensure the public interest was protected while an active review was underway, while also being as transparent as possible regarding information that is not directly within scope of that review. Police advised the IPCA of those consultations and the proposed approach to be adopted to OIA requests.

On 3 May 2022, DPMC communicated with ODESC attendees seeking any concerns with the ODESC minutes being released publicly. Police was not made aware that the proposed release related to an OIA request in those communications.

In its reply on 3 May, Police advised DPMC of its consultation with the Ombudsman and that it would be withholding material that goes to the heart of the matters that are under investigation and review by the IPCA, in reliance upon section 9(2)(ba)(ii) of the OIA.

Police notified DPMC that it considered the ODESC minutes and any associated material directly related to Police engagement with local and national agencies, which is a matter specifically in scope of the Review.

Decisions to release or withhold official information sit with the individual agency to which the request for information is made. While consultation occurred regarding the ODESC minutes, and Police shared its views, it is ultimately up to DPMC to determine whether to release the information that it holds.

The IPCA anticipates the Review will be completed and reported on by 31 March 2023. Police recognises the importance of transparency in these matters and looks forward to the release of the IPCA's report, at which time more detailed information regarding the Police response to the Protest is likely to be publicly available.

## Request for information

Thank you for your request of 23 June 2022, in which you requested the following:

Can I have figures, and explanations, for the number of cases that have already resolved from those arrested as a result of the occupation of Parliament (appears to be 259 people)?

For instance, if 259 people arrested, how many released without charge, how many were offered diversion, how many pleaded guilty and been dealt with, how many defendants have had charges against them withdrawn or no evidence offered? I'm aware, for instance, that some prosecutions have been dropped because the arresting officer improvised the wording of the standard Bill of Rights caution. How many cases have been dropped as a result of police acknowledging a shortcoming in the prosecution? Give details please.

Your request has been considered in accordance with the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA), and I can now provide the following response.

As you may be aware, the Independent Police Conduct Authority (IPCA) has commenced an independent investigation and review (Review) of the policing of the occupation on and around Parliament grounds in Wellington during February and March 2022 (Protest).

Details of the scope of the Review are available on the IPCA's website<sup>1</sup> and you will note this scope includes Police operational execution, and the powers used to keep the peace, maintain public safety, enforce the law, and provide community support and reassurance, and the tactical exercise of those powers.

Whilst this Review is underway, information relating to the issues under investigation and review is expected to be the subject of examination by the IPCA under its powers of investigation under the IPCA Act 1988. With this Review commenced, there is a strong public interest in allowing these matters to be considered in the round by the IPCA.

In the meantime, we can confirm that 252 persons were arrested in total between 9 February and 4 March. As of 29 June, Police records show that:

- 129 persons still have charges active in court
- Seven persons have pleaded guilty to charges
- Four persons have received diversion
- Two youths have received youth referrals
- 92 persons have had all charges withdrawn

• 18 persons had no charges filed.

This work continues to progress, and the numbers change regularly. Regarding charges being withdrawn or not filed, this can occur for a wide range of reasons including the public interest, evidential sufficiency, further information coming to light, engagement with the individual and their solicitor, and the use of Police discretion to support an appropriate outcome.

To provide specific detail of the rationale behind withdrawing or not filing a charge in each individual case would require a manual review of each person's prosecution file which would take substantial research and collation. The request for this is therefore refused under section 18(f) of the OIA.

The second phase of the Police investigation into criminal activity is still underway. While the number of people identified or sought by Police is part of the ongoing investigation, as of 7 July there had been a further 13 prosecutions and a supported resolution referral for one youth, as part of that investigation. As the investigation continues further arrests are possible.

The IPCA anticipates the Review will be completed and reported on by 31 March 2023. Police recognises the importance of transparency in these matters and looks forward to the release of the IPCA's report, at which time more detailed information regarding the Police response to the Protest is likely to be publicly available.
