Te Tohu o te Huia The story behind the Police Remembrance Day Pin

The Police Remembrance Day Pin was developed by the Police Association and New Zealand Police, who have been working together to raise the profile of Police Remembrance Day in the hearts and minds of police staff and the general public nationwide.

Now lost to us, the huia bird's tail plumage is something rare and special. To wear it is considered by Māori to be a great honour. By incorporating the Police chevron into the huia tail feather, the design of the pin symbolises the honouring of someone special, now lost to Police.

Police staff throughout New Zealand take part in Police Remembrance Day by wearing the pin to honour the memory of those police officers slain while carrying out their police duties.
