Funding to Support ReFrame

Portfolio

Justice / Police

Purpose

This paper seeks approval to \$28.260 million over three years for ReFrame, the

Police service delivery transformation programme.

Previous Decisions

None.

Proposal

ReFrame is a three-year transformation programme that will modernise Police's operational model (see Appendix One \$\frac{59(2)(f)(iv)}{2}\$

he Minister of Justice agreed to fund the programme from the

Proceeds of Crime Fund (PoCF).

Following further work by officials, the Minister of Justice and Minister of Police support the mixed-funding model sought in this paper, made up of \$25.260 million from the PoCF, a \$3.0 million transfer from Vote Corrections to Vote Police, and a \$4.0 million drawdown in 2024/25 from the Victims of Crime

- Improving Outcomes tagged contingency (Vote Corrections).

Impact Analysis

Not required.

Financial Implications

ReFrame requires total funding of \$44.520 million over three years. Police has absorbed initial set-up costs of \$7.16 million and will contribute a further \$12.26 million towards ReFrame over the three-years. Further re-prioritisation

within Police or the Justice cluster envelope is not feasible.

As at January 2023, the PoCF has uncommitted funds of \$28.866 million. ReFrame will use nearly all this available funding, which reduces any ability to fund community-based initiatives until revenue is replenished. Current proposals for funding from the PoCF have been halted until the ReFrame

funding is considered.

Timing Matters

The funding sought in this paper will be allocated across 2022/23 to 2024/25.

Paper prepared by MoJ and Police. Corrections, Treasury, DPMC (Prime Minister), Te Kawa Mataaho, and MDP were consulted.
